City Manager's Message

The 2014 Resident and Business Survey results are in and we are pleased to report that the City continues to meet the needs and expectations of the community with 90% of residents and 87% of businesses satisfied with our efforts to provide municipal services. In addition, 92% of residents offered positive ratings (excellent or good) for the quality of life in Lake Forest. Conducted every two years by an independent firm commissioned by the City, the survey provides a statistically reliable snapshot in time. The



survey is one of the City's many tools for engaging with the community, providing valuable feedback on the opinions, priorities, and concerns of residents and businesses. To view the full survey, please visit the City's website at www.lakeforestca.gov/2014survey.

The Survey results, in addition to community feedback gathered from other sources, are used by the City Council to make strategic decisions regarding services, projects, programming, facilities, and amenities, which are documented in the City's Five-Year Strategic Business Plan. Updated every two years, the Strategic Business Plan serves as the foundation for the Annual Operating Budget and the Two-Year Capital Improvement Project (CIP) budget.

The City's 2015-2020 Five-Year Strategic Business Plan is currently in development. If you would like to participate in the process, community members are welcomed to attend a Five-Year Strategic Plan Development workshop in late March. Look for the date on the City's website in the next few weeks. A draft of the 2015-2020 Five-Year Strategic Business Plan will be available on the City's website and start to be reviewed at public meetings in May. Community members interested in participating in the development of the Plan are invited to attend these public meetings. The Plan will also be available on the City's website this summer, along with the Operating and Capital Improvement Project budgets.

As always, we appreciate your feedback and look forward to continuing to exceed your expectations.



Scam Buster

If you're instructed to purchase a

Green Dot Money Pak and reload the card, STOP, it's a scam to get cash from victims!

Scammers use the pin or the card to transfer money to another account. Reputable organizations will not demand payment and then restrict a person to pay with non-traceable means.

If you receive this call...

- 1. Hang up and do not make the payment.
- 2. Contact the agency to verify the debt.
- 3. Contact law enforcement for an incident report.

WHAT IS IDENTITY THEFT?

Identity theft occurs when an individual's financial or personal information is taken for the purpose of assuming that person's identity to make unauthorized transactions or purchases.

How Identity Theft Works

DUMPSTER DIVING Removing documents with confidential information from trash bins.

SKIMMING Stealing credit card numbers by using a special storage device attached to a credit/debit machine when processing cards.

PHISHING Pretending to be a financial institution or company by sending spam or pop-up messages to get a person to reveal his/her personal information.

HACKING Illegally accessing an individual's computer to retrieve personal information.

Ways To Protect Yourself



Shred papers with confidential information. Lake Forest Police Services offers free shredding program for residents.



Refrain from providing personal information over the phone unless you originated the call.



Check for skimmers or signs that a machine has been tampered with.



Avoid clicking on email links claiming to be "your bank." Log onto their official site instead.



Check credit reports regularly (Equifax, Experian, TransUnion).



Secure and use different passwords.




