Lake Forest's Fiscal Year 2015-16 budget marks another year of consecutive balanced budgets. Carefully crafted to embody fiscal responsibility and long-term sustainability, the City is in good shape to continue delivering high quality services, amenities, and public projects the community has come to expect.

As we carefully manage our capital funds and live within our financial means, the City will continue to make investments to improve the overall quality of life for the community. A focal project this year is designing the Lake Forest Civic Center – dubbed the community's 100-Year Home. The Civic Center will encompass a meeting center, senior center, performing arts theater, and an emergency operations center.

This balanced budget keeps Lake Forest on track as we continue to provide high quality services and deliver important capital projects.





Fair Housing

An impediment to fair housing opportunity is any policy or practice that denies or adversely affects the provision of housing to a person in any protected class. Examples of a protected class include minorities, elderly, and disabled persons. As a recipient of annual Federal Community Development Block Grant funds, the City of Lake Forest is committed to furthering fair housing practices in the community and cooperates with the Fair Housing Council of Orange County to eliminate discriminatory practices county-wide. TRAFFIC AND ENVIRONMENT



PAST Last summer, the City hosted three traffic forums to hear your thoughts and opinions about traffic in and around the City. As a result, new projects were added to the City's existing roster. Completed projects include installation of a "No Outlet" sign on Cherry Avenue east of Trabuco Road, and three major traffic signal synchronization projects - Los Alisos Boulevard, Lake Forest Drive, and Santa Margarita Parkway.

PRESENT The City continues to engage the community on this important priority. This summer, a seven-member Citizen Traffic Advisory Group (CTAG) comprised of Lake Forest residents has already started to provide input to City staff on ways to make your ride smoother. Visit lakeforestca.gov/ctag for more information. In addition, the Saddleback Ranch Road Project is underway. Construction has begun in the area of Saddleback Ranch Road to improve safety and access to Portola Hills Elementary School. The project is expected to be completed by the end of this year.

FUTURE A number of traffic-related projects will be completed in the upcoming year, including full synchronization of five additional street segments which will help improve traffic flow. For more information, visit lakeforestca.gov/currentprojects.

CONSCRICE While Preventing Pollution

In the last Leaflet, the City shared some of the ways we are conserving water. With California facing one of the most severe droughts on record, everyone's help to conserve our precious resource will not only make a huge impact but also reduce the amount of pollutants entering our local creeks, lakes, and ocean.

Here's what you can do to reduce water consumption and prevent pollution:

- 1) Use a shut-off nozzle attachment on your hose.
- 2) Sweep patios, walkways, and driveways instead of washing them down.
- 3) Periodically run your sprinkler system to check and fix broken or leaking sprinkler lines or heads.
