Why is Redistricting Important?

- Districts must be made as equal in population as practicable so that communities have equal access to political representation.
- How and where districts are drawn can shape a community's ability to elect the representatives of their choice. Avoid "cracking" and "packing" minority populations.



What are the traditional Redistricting Criteria?

- **Contiguity:** all parts of a district should connect.
- **Compactness:** districts should be geographically compact. No gerrymandering.
- Existing Boundaries: easily identifiable boundaries that follow natural or artificial barriers (for example, rivers, streets, highways, rail lines, etc.)
- **Communities of Interest:** districts should preserve neighborhoods and communities of people sharing common interest.





What type of public input are we seeking from the community?

- What streets, boundaries, or points of interest define your community?
- Does your community have major geographical boundaries?
- What are your shared interests?



Why is it so important to protect communities of interest?

To preserve communities that share common interests and should be included in a single district in order to have effective and fair representation.

Examples of shared interests:

- Housing patterns
- Common Culture
- Language
- Public Services
- Points of Interest






What Does the current Lake Forest District Map look like?












Potential Map A


